The past couple of months have been full of activity on the farm, the garden and yard is playing host to a great range of fledglings including blackbirds, house martins and swallows. Here is a picture of the house martins in the farmyard in June busy collecting mud for their nests, we keep a puddle here constantly for the birds to enjoy. Harvest has started and we have combined the oilseed-rape and barley – a great range of species are certainly enjoying gleaning the seed left from the combine, we have a noticeable increase in Yellowhammers on the stubbles this year.

Our farm walk season has come to an end, this year we had over 100 visitors of all ages visit the farm for a tour with information on how conservation and modern farming work together. The redkites, skylarks and fieldfare were just a few of the species who put on a fine display for the visitors, the badgers kept quiet as we walked past their set, but there was clear evidence of a happy family there.

There were celebrations on the farm this summer as the Johnson family celebrate 75 years at Rectory Farm! We planted a red oak to celebrate the occasion.
